During an inspection on 3/12/2021 at Happy North Garden, located at 2900 Cassopolis St., Pretreatment staff found two of the three indoor grease traps not in operational order (Violation #1 and Violation #2). Happy North Garden received a certified letter on April 6, 2021 outlining that the two grease traps in non-operational order must either be removed or replaced by June 30, 2021. Removal is permissible because Happy North Garden has a 2,000 gallon grease interceptor installed outside. To date the two indoor grease traps have not been removed or replaced. These are the first and second violations of this type within a year. Happy North Garden did respond to the Notice of Violation received on September 28, 2021, however, the response was received 1 day late on October 14, 2021 (Violation #3). The Penalty Matrices recommends assessing a total penalty of \$800.

Attached is change order request #3 for the N. Main Street Water Replacement project. This change order is for the changes by the Simonton intersection and additional parts that were ordered.

This change order to increase Niblock Excavating, Inc. contracts costs for quantity adjustments at a cost of \$10,245.00. During construction, a 6" forcemain had to be relocated into a manhole south of Simonton. Additionally, due to the material shortage, an additional 24" butterfly valve was ordered and delivered to Public Works with hopes to expedite the delays on the project due to this valve being delayed by other vendors.

This change order request is for an increase of \$10,245.00 to the current contract price of \$1,547,708.00. Approval of change order #3 would increase the current contract price to \$1,557,953.00 resulting in a 1.9% overall decrease from the original contract price of \$1,587,977.50.

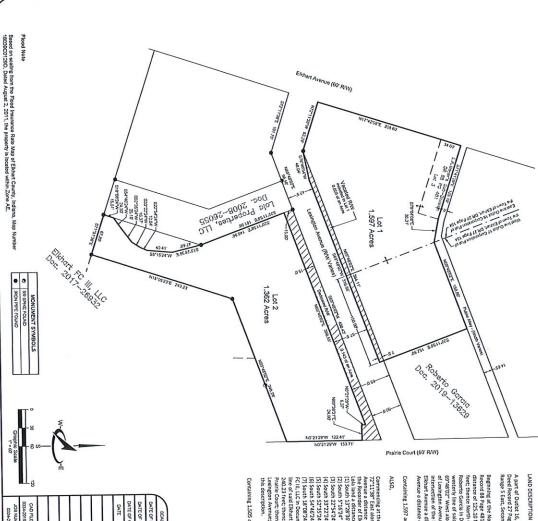

The monthly Wastewater Treatment Plant NetDMR, CSO MRO, and Marketing and Distribution reports were all submitted electronically for the month of October. The wastewater treatment plant treated and released 486 million gallons to the St Joseph River.

CSO Events:

Nine wet weather CSO events occurred in October.

Violations: Two incident reports were filed in October. On October 27, evidence was found of a back-up at manhole 140-107. The city's largest lift station immediately downstream of this location was under construction at the time. By-pass pumping does accommodate dry flow capacity, but wet weather capacity is limited. On October 29, a back-up occurred at 2461 Muirfield Drive. Work was done at the downstream lift station that day. When the work was done, that station was not properly returned to full operation.

Zoning Ordinance update

Elkhart, Indiana

Dear Board of Works Members:

Planning staff are working to update the zoning ordinance to a Unified Development Ordinance (UDO). This update will incorporate the zoning, subdivision and preservation ordinances into one document. The purpose of this update is to make the document easier to navigate for the development community, site selectors, as well as citizens looking for information related to development in Elkhart. With the growth the City is experiencing, this document format is becoming more common in the state and across the country because of the graphic examples, charts relaying concepts and hyperlinks embedded in the document to quickly access parallel developmental regulations and regulations. This format also reduces the redundancy that exists between multiple ordinances by having the relevant information in one place – thus making the timeline shorter for the preliminary interactions that occur frequently prior to development.

REA has provided Development Services with a proposal which includes their scope of work, professional fee, and schedule (to be determined with assistance of Task Force) – anticipated to be 12 to 14 months.

For the service offered, Rundell Ernstberger Associates (REA) agrees that the City shall not pay more than \$149,500.00 for these services. Funding for this contract has been appropriated from existing contracts not completed due to COVID in 2020, professional services dollars for 2021 and 2022 and additional funding from the Redevelopment Commission. As such, the City is requesting that a motion be made to approve and the agreement with REA which contract limit the amount the City/will pay for services to \$149,500.00.

Included as part of the Civil City and Public Works budgets were performance based raises for full time employees that are not included in one of the five (5) collectively bargained groups. As you may also be aware the City is currently working to fill the Human Resources Director role and as a result lacks the bandwidth and subject matter expertise to efficiently roll out an effective pay for performance program in the limited time left this year.

The City approached Megan Nail from First Person to assist in developing training materials for managers, to provide live onsite training, and to assist with the development of a Merit Matrix. First Person has experience working with Cities of similar size and the administration is confident that they will add necessary value as we work to further implement our pay for performance model.
