### **CALL TO ORDER**

This meeting was held in-person, telephonically and virtually through WEBEX. Mrs. Schreiber called the meeting to order at 4:02 pm. Roll call was taken at the beginning of the meeting.

### **AMENDMENT OF FEBRUARY 14, 2023 AGENDA**

Mrs. Schreiber asked for a motion to amend the March 14, 2023 Agenda by adding American Structurepoint to the agenda. Moved by Ms. Harris. Seconded by Mr. Steffen. Voice vote. All in favor, motion approved.

### APPROVAL OF FEBRUARY 14, 2023 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

Mrs. Schreiber asked for a motion to approve the February 14, 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes. Moved by Ms. Harris. Seconded by Mr. Holtz. Voice vote. All in favor, minutes approved.

### A. OPEN OFFERS

Mr. Adam Fann addressed the commission stating there are no bids to open.

### **B. AMEND ELECTRONIC MEETING RESOLUTION**

### D. SOUTH MAIN LOTS - PREMIER ARTS

Mr. Adam Fann addressed the commission and answered their questions. Mrs. Schreiber asked for a motion to approve the purchase agreement for Premier Art's vacant lot in the 400 block of South Main Street and appropriate \$200,000 from the Downtown Allocation Area No. 1 Special Fund to cover the costs of acquisition, any inspections, environmental review, property surveys and closing costs Moved by Mr. Roberts. Seconded by Ms. Harris. Voice vote. One abstention, four in favor, motion approved.

### E. 1000 BLOCK OF SOUTH MAIN ASBESTOS

Mr. Adam Fann addressed the commission and answered their questions. Mrs. Schreiber asked for a motion to approve the employment of A&G Environmental Solutions, LLC to perform asbestos surveys in the 1000 block of South Main and appropriate \$4,350 from the Allocation Area No. 1 Special Fund to cover those costs. Moved by Mr. Steffen. Seconded by Mr. Roberts. Voice vote. All in favor, motion approved.

### F. ENVIRONMENTAL RESTRICTIVE COVENANT FOR 511 DIVISION STREET

### G. 1560 1/2 SOUTH MAIN STREET OFFERING

- South Main We just had a preconstruction meeting for South Main stuff that should start in April. We had a conversation with Indiana Brownfield on several lots we own and different mitigation processes we can do and possibly get the restrictive covenant removed.
- Kelby Love Mural Meeting scheduled with a mason and the Notre Dame School of Architecture to see what can be done for preservation or partial preservation of the Kelby Love mural. Looking at all option.

Mary Kaczka addressed the Commission with an update on the Woodland Crossing Mall.

 Woodland Crossing Mall-Mary Kaczka handed out a timeline for the Woodland Crossing Mall and answered any questions the commission had.


Whereas, the Commission believes it is in the best interest of the City and its inhabitants that the same be approved.

### Who was served by the project/program?\*

We had more than 10,000 attendees over the 7 ArtWalk dates. The age range was birth to 90 years old. Our focus on families and younger children was realized with a much younger demographic of attendees participating than in previous years. The attendees reflected our diverse community both in ethnicity and range of incomes.

### How much did you do?\*

How many activities did you provide? How many people participated?

We held 7 ArtWalk dates with an average of 25 artists, 12 merchant partners, and 10 community partners for each event. We had growing attendance at each event totally more than 10,000 attendees over the 7 dates. See the data table attached in the documents below for further detail about each event's activities and numbers of participants.

### How well did you do it?\*

Did the implementation plan go as expected? Did the project hit target levels of participation/completion, etc.?

We expected implementation to go smoothly as we have a great deal of experience in planning, executing, and promoting community-wide events. We are proud to report that the roll-out was smooth and well-received. We hit our target levels of participation from new demographic groups and overall attendance doubling our attendance from April to October and more than tripling total attendance from 2021.

### Is anyone better off?\*

How many (number and %) participants reported or demonstrated improvement? How has the project improved the quality of life in Elkhart County?

Elkhart County is definitely better off after ArtWalk 2022. When people are proud of where they live, when they can engage with arts and culture activities, and when families have a safe place to take their kids, placemaking is happening! The city of Elkhart specifically can be very proud of hosting thousands of attendees in our beautiful city while showcasing the talent in our community and region. ### Community Partners (non-financial)\*

If the project included other partners, did those partnerships go as planned?

Our partnership with the Lerner as very successful. They hosted the Lerner on the Lawn concert series in conjunction with ArtWalk and the community loved it! Furthermore, for each different ArtWalk theme there was a new list of community partners that participated. For instance Pet Refuge and the Humane Society were front and center on our Dog Days of Summer Theme. We have a volunteer fair with 14 different non-profits during our "Play Your Part" theme. All of the merchant partners, artists, and community partners can be seen in the attached monthly ArtWalk maps!

### Outcomes\*

What were the actual outcomes achieved? If your goals/outcomes were not reached, what barriers prevented you from accomplishing them?

We were pleased with the goals we accomplished. As stated above we wanted to see:

- 1. a measurable uptick in business for our artists, downtwon merchants and restaurants on these 7 dates-We found that the restaurants and artists definitely saw more business on these dates. The artists were very happy with the new format of having them all located in one place on Civic Plaza as they had a lot more exposure to the public as compared to when they used to located in the merchant locations. As evidenced by the uptick in artists participating throughout the 7 months, word definitely circulated that sales were more consistent than in year's past. Restaurants also saw an increase in patrons on these nights. Stores and boutiques didn't see as much of an increase as the family demographic of attendees were less likely to take time to shop in the stores. We accomplished this goal in 2 out of 3 categories.
- 2. Thousands of people visiting downtown to engage in positive programming that celebrates the arts and our local artists.- Attendance at ArtWalk 2022 grew by 100% over the 7 dates and more than tripled any attendance at the 2021 ArtWalk. We accomplished this goal quite well!
- 3. Engaging more diverse artists and audiences than ever before. This goal was definitely realized as we offered dozens of family friendly activities that brought out a younger demographic. We also featured different cultures in our themes resulting in a new cultural demographic as well.

### 2022 Marketing Plan Updates


Website: The completely redesigned ElkhartArtWalk.com received 14,700 page visits. See attached monthly maps that illustrate the amazing amount of participants and activities. These were updated for each event and available on our website, social media and via QR code on ArtWalk signs and on merchant windows.

Social Media: The Elkhart ArtWalk Facebook page grew by 430 followers and the Instagram page grew by 600+. There were 3023 Page Visits and 49,913 Page reach. Elkhart Community Schools, The Elkhart Merchants Alliance, Premier Arts, The Lerner, and The City of Elkhart all shared ArtWalk posts and promotions.

E-Blast: ArtWalk and its sponsors were featured more than 20 times in our e-newsletter with over 11,000 subscribers.

PR: ArtWalk was featured on Hometown Living 7 times and WNDU 5 times. We were in the Elkhart Truth 5 times as well.

Signs: Alphagraphics printed 50 new a-frame signs (see below) for us that were displayed throughout the event and along main st. All sponsors were included on the signage. We also re-named the Artisan Market the "Well Crafted Artisan Market" to carry the ECCVB branding through the event.
