

Public Works respectfully requests that the Board of Public Works approve the attached resolution directing Bryan Cress to hire a broker for the sale of the property at 28864 W County Road 16, Elkhart, IN 46516.

The Board previously approved putting the property up for sale using a bidding process. The property has been up for bid for sixty days without receiving a bid and now state law allows the Board to hire a broker to sell the property and pay the broker a reasonable compensation out of the gross proceeds of the sale. The industry standard compensation is somewhat in flux due to recent settlements on the structure of compensation; however, traditionally commissions were five to six percent. This resolution limits my authority to agree to no more than a five percent commission.


