I received the following email from Lt. Walsh of the Elkhart County Homicide Unit

"Sir,

In addition to the email I just sent regarding the uniform officers involved in the homicide from yesterday, I also want to add something about Carlos.

It's my understanding that Carlos was on his way home from working 12 hours when he heard the call go out. He recognized that he could be of benefit to the investigation as most parties involved in the incident spoke Spanish. Instead of going home, he made the decision to go to the call knowing that it would likely result in him working at least several more hours, again, beyond the 12 hours he had already worked.

When I spoke with Carlos at the scene he was knowledgeable on the progress of the investigation which greatly assisted when he and I were communicating with people. As things at the scene were beginning to wind down, he agreed to assist the homicide unit by translating during interviews and returned to our office were he was involved in at least two valuable interviews. All of this was completed while he was holding at least somewhat (based on my understanding) of a supervisory role at the scene.

Had Carlos not made the decision he did by going to the shooting call, our investigation would likely not be as far along as it is, and it certainly wouldn't have done as efficiently as it was. His efforts and willingness to do what he knew needed to be done are appreciated.

Re: Compliance Agreements

The City of Elkhart, through its Building Commissioner, may need to enter into compliance agreements with property owners in order to rehabilitate and maintain their properties in compliance with the City's Building Code, City Ordinances, and the International Property Maintenance Code as adopted by the City of Elkhart. Each of these agreements is reviewed by the Board's attorney, who approves said documents as to form and legality prior to the Board's execution.

There are instances where these property owner agreements are ready for Board approval, and the next scheduled meeting is several weeks away. These instances are sometimes unpredictable and difficult to anticipate.

In these situations, the Building Commissioner is available and capable of reviewing these agreements with the Board's attorney and determining the accuracy of said agreements. It would be beneficial to the effective and efficient procedure of the City of Elkhart Building Department to authorize the Building Commissioner to be a signatory for the execution of these compliance agreements with property owners, subject to the Board's attorney approval of said agreements. The Board must ratify these agreements signed by the Building Commissioner at its next meeting. This authorization shall expire on December 31, 2025.

Please approve the attached Resolution authorizing the Building Commissioner to approve compliance agreements.

A&G Environmental Solution, LLC has submitted a proposed agreement to the City to assist the Administration and the Department of Building and Code Enforcement in complying with the requirements of the National Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).

The services which A&G Environmental Solution, LLC will provide include, but are not necessarily limited to, inspecting and identifying suspect Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) and Presumed ACM in some structures located in the City, providing complete reports for the inspected properties, and managing the corresponding asbestos removal.

Please approve the attached agreement to be made between the City of Elkhart and A&G Environmental Solutions, LLC, and authorize the Building Commissioner to sign it on behalf of the City of Elkhart.

CONTRACT FOR THE ASBESTOS INSPECTION AND REMOVAL

This Agreement is made and entered into this _____ of January 2025, by and between the CITY OF ELKHART, INDIANA, ("CITY") located at 229 S. Second Street, Elkhart IN 46516, and A&G ENVIRONMENTAL SOLUTION'S LLC., ("CONTRACTOR") located at 12191 North Woodland Acres Dr, Syracuse, IN 46567.

RECITALS:

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to be in compliance with the requirements of the National Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) by inspecting and identifying suspect Asbestos Containing Materials (ACM) and Presumed ACM in some structures located in the City ("Premises"); and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to retain the services of a competent contractor with the necessary equipment, expertise, and personnel to undertake the disposal of asbestos; and

WHEREAS, the CONTRACTOR represents that it has the requisite expertise and ability to complete this project and guarantees that CONTRACTOR is properly bonded and registered with the City of Elkhart and with the City of Elkhart's Department of Building and Code Enforcement;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

SECTION 1. Scope of Services.

CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish the services listed in the Project A&G Ref 250102, attached to this Contract as Exhibit A.

SECTION 2. Schedule.

Services described in Section 1 shall commence within a reasonable amount of time from CITY approval of this Agreement is communicated to CONTRACTOR. All services and tasks associated therewith shall progress continuously until the demolition is complete.

SECTION 3. Payment.

In consideration for the services rendered under this contract, the CITY agrees to pay to the CONTRACTOR in the terms and conditions established in the attached Exhibit A. No payment shall be made until the City's inspection reveals that the work is entirely completed and no advance payment will be made.

SECTION 4. Insurance.

The Contractor shall secure and keep in force during the term of this Contract, the following insurance coverages, covering the Contractor for any and all claims of any nature which may in any manner arise out of or result from Contractor performance under this Contract:

Commercial general liability, including contractual coverage, and products or completed operations coverage (if applicable), with minimum liability limits of \$1,000,000 per person and \$5,000,000 per occurrence unless additional coverage is required by the City or the State. The City and State are to be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis for any liability arising directly or indirectly under or in connection with this Contract.

Automobile liability with minimum liability limits of \$700,000 per person and \$5,000,000 per occurrence. The City and State are to be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

The Contractor shall provide proof of such insurance coverage by tendering to the undersigned City representative a certificate of insurance prior to the commencement of this Contract and proof of worker's compensation coverage meeting all statutory requirements of Indiana Code 22-3-2. In addition, proof of an "all states endorsement" covering claims occurring outside the State is required if any of the services provided under this Contract involve work outside of Indiana.

The Contractor's insurance coverage must meet the following additional requirements:

- A. The insurer must have a certificate of City issued by the Indiana Department of Insurance.
- B. Any deductible or self-insured retention amount or other similar obligation under the insurance policies shall be the sole obligation of the Contractor.
- C. The City and the State will be defended, indemnified and held harmless to the full extent of any coverage actually secured by the Contractor in excess of the minimum requirements set forth above. The duty to indemnify the City and the State under this Contract shall not be limited by the insurance required in this Contract.
- D. The insurance required in this Contract, through a policy or endorsement, shall include a provision that the policy and endorsements may not be canceled or modified without thirty (30) days prior written notice to the City.
- E. Failure to provide insurance as required in this Contract may be deemed a material breach of contract entitling the City to immediately terminate this Contract.

SECTION 5. Indemnification.

Except to the extent paid in settlement from any applicable insurance policies, and to the extent permitted by applicable law, each Party agrees to Indemnify and hold harmless the other Party, and its respective affiliates, officers, agents, employees, and permitted successors and assigns against any and all claims, losses, damages, liabilities, penalties, punitive damages, expenses, reasonable legal fees and cost of any kind or amount whatsoever, which result from or arise out of any act or omission of the Indemnifying party, its respective affiliates, officers, agents, employees, and permitted successors and assigns that occurs in connection with Agreement. This Indemnification will survive the termination of the Agreement.

SECTION 6. Assignment.

Neither this agreement nor any interest of CONTRACTOR herein may be assigned, sublet, or transferred to a third party without prior written consent of the CITY.

SECTION 7. Governing Law.

This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with and governed by the laws of the State of Indiana and any suit based thereon must be brought in the Superior or Circuit Court of Elkhart County, Indiana.

SECTION 8. Compliance with State and Local Law.

CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations, or ordinances that are applicable at the time of CONTRACTOR'S services pursuant to this Agreement are rendered, and all provisions required thereby to be included herein are hereby incorporated by reference.

SECTION 9. E-Verify Compliance.

All terms defined in LC. § 22-5-1.7 et seq. are adopted and incorporated into this section. Pursuant to LC. § 22-5-1.7 et seq., CONTRACTOR shall enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all of its newly-hired employees using the E-Verify program, if it has not already done so as of the date of this Agreement CONTRACTOR is further required to execute an affidavit affirming that: (i) it is enrolled and is participating in the E-verify program, and (ii) does not knowingly employ any unauthorized aliens. In support of the affidavit, CONTRACTOR shall provide the CITY with documentation that it has enrolled and is participating in the E-Verify program. This Agreement shall not take effect until said affidavit is signed by CONTRACTOR and delivered to the CITY's authorized representative.

Should CONTRACTOR subcontract for the performance of any work under this Agreement, the CONTRACTOR shall require any subcontractor(s) to certify by affidavit that: (i) the subcontractor does not knowingly employ or contract with any unauthorized aliens, and (ii) has enrolled and is participating in the E-verify program. CONTRACTOR shall maintain a copy of such certification for the duration of the term of any subcontract. CONTRACTOR shall also deliver a copy of the certification to the CITY within seven (7) days of the effective date of the subcontract.

If Contractor, or any subcontractor of Contractor, knowingly employs or contracts with any unauthorized aliens, or retains an employee or contract with a person that the CONTRACTOR or subcontractor subsequently learns is an unauthorized alien, CONTRACTOR shall terminate the employment of or contract with the unauthorized alien within thirty (30) days ("Cure Period"). Should the CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor of CONTRACTOR fail to cure within the Cure Period, the CITY has the right to terminate this Agreement without consequence.

The E-Verify requirements of this Agreement will not apply should the E-Verify program cease to exist.

SECTION 10. Supplement.

This Agreement may only be amended, supplemented or modified by a written document executed in the same manner as this Agreement.

SECTION 11. Entire Agreement.

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties, and, unless specified otherwise herein, no representations, inducement, promises, or prior agreements, or all or written between the parties, or made by any agent on behalf of the patties or otherwise, shall be of any force and effect.

SECTION 12. Authority.

The persons signing this Agreement warrant that they have the authority to sign as, or on behalf of, the party for whom they are signing.

SECTION 13. Nondiscrimination.

CONTRACTOR shall not be in violation of Elkhart City Ordinance No. 4101, for the duration of this agreement. Should CONTRACTOR be in violation of any of the aforementioned provisions, such shall be considered a material breach of this agreement.

SECTION 14. Severability.

In the event that any portion of this Agreement is found to be invalid it shall be deemed severed and the remainder of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect as if the severed portion did not exist.

SECTION 15. Council Appropriation.

In the event funds for the payment of services pursuant to this Agreement are not appropriated by the Elkhart City Common Council, then, the CITY shall have the right to terminate this Agreement without penalty by giving prior written notice to CONTRACTOR.

Nathanael Eddy, and Cpl. Bryce Moore. These Officers put their lives in jeopardy to save the lives of others in a very difficult and dangerous situation. On their way to respond to an unrelated call for service, Cpl. Headley and Cpl. Moore saw that 222 W Jefferson Street was on fire with flames coming out of the third floor windows. They stopped and notified dispatch. As they approached the home they were met by a woman who said there were still people inside. They immediately entered the residence and began checking for occupants, running up to the third floor where they had to force open a door and help people evacuate. One was a woman who could not walk and Ptl. Moore and another man carried her to safety. Cpl. Eddy arrived and evacuated the basement. They also evacuated surrounding homes for safety. Nine people were transported to the hospital with non-life threatening injuries. We know that was a direct result of what they did. We are proud of the bravery and Life Saving actions these Officers took to save others with no injuries to themselves. Thank you! Well done Officers!

Chief Milanese presented Life Saving Awards to Cpl. Nathanial Toth, Chaplain Cerda, Cpl. Gavin Headley. When someone is in crisis, the way you deescalate them is vital. It gives them time to slow down and think. This is a great example of the training and ability of these individuals. These Officers arrived on Nappanee Street Bridge after receiving a call that there was an individual hanging over the side of the bridge with what was believed an intent to harm himself. Chaplain Certa was able to build a rapport with the individual, and used her ability to speak Spanish to effectively communicate with the person in need of help. This communication proved to be vital in the Life Saving efforts for this individual. Officers Toth and Headley were able to get close enough to restrain the individual just as he was letting go of the railing indicating he intended to end his life. The Officers were able to pull him back over the rail to safety and prevent him from harming himself. Their efforts, ability, quick thinking and willingness to act in a time of crisis to save an individual from harming himself, all while placing themselves in danger is commendable. Thank you so much! Well done Officers!

Chief Milanese presented a commendation for Cpl. Clay Martin. He was commended for his outstanding police work and dedicated service to the Elkhart community. While he was at Martin's Supermarket, a woman approached him. Her grandson got his hand caught in the wheels of a shopping cart. He took the time to help him remove his hand, attend to the boy's injury, administer first aid, and bandage it while remaining calm and reassuring. He demonstrated compassion and empathy by offering the boy a stuffed animal. The boy named the animal "Officer", reflecting on the positive impression Cpl. Martin made on him. His actions reflect highly upon the Elkhart Police Department and the law enforcement profession. We are proud to recognize him for his exceptional police work. Job well done!
