The Environmental Center

Between 1959 and 1972, the area that became the environmental center was operated as the Lusher Avenue city dump. To implement early remediation ideas, the City of Elkhart formed partnerships with the University of Notre Dame and Elkhart Community Schools. In 1991, the Martin Foundation, a charitable division of NIBCO, generously donated funds for the construction of a log cabin education center. Later that year, the Center was officially dedicated to the people of Elkhart. With the education facility, beautiful hiking trails, and habitat reconstruction, the Elkhart Environmental Center has established itself as a resource for community environmental education.
