RECITALS

Elkhart Parks and Recreation ("Parks") is a department of the City organized under the provisions of §36-10-3-1 et. seq. of the Indiana Code.

Beacon Health and Fitness Elkhart ("BHF") is a local fitness center dedicated to helping the community reach its health, fitness, and well-being goals.

Beacon Health and Fitness desires to offer structured programming to participants at The Commons for the benefit of the local community. Parks has the staff and experience to provide programming and desires to offer basketball lessons at the BHF Elkhart. The Park's basketball program is run by Todd Johnson, an Elkhart City employee. Todd Johnson will introduce a series of intense training and drills to youth. Todd Johnson, a former professional international basketball player, has experience conducting trainings and workshops for local agencies such as the City of Elkhart, Indiana, and Five Star Life.

City and BHF Elkhart believe it is in the best interest of the parties to this agreement to agree to establish and/or clarify their respective rights and responsibilities concerning the operation and funding of this program.

In consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Parks will lead the program every Monday and Wednesday in January and February 2023 with the following exceptions:
 - a. Lessons will not be offered on the following dates: January 2, January 16, and February 20.
- 2. The program will take place at BHF Elkhart.

- 3. Parks will pay \$00.00 for the space at BHF Elkhart.
- 4. The classes will be conducted in two timeframes:
 - a. 4:00 PM 4:45 PM and
 - b. 5:00 PM 6:00 PM.
- 5. Participants will be split into two age groups:
 - a. 7 to 9 years old from 4:00 PM to 4:45 PM and
 - b. 10 to 12 years old from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM.
- 6. The registered participant minimum is 5, and the maximum is 20 participants. (Registration of 4 and below in either age group will justify program cancellation).
- 7. The participant program cost is \$25 per child, which will be paid directly to Parks.
- 8. Parks will keep 100% of the program fees.
- 9. Parks will create an online registration form and fee collection process.
- 10. Parks will conduct the entirety of the program; Parks will conduct the training, the classes, and the registration. Parks will provide Beacon with promotional materials.
- 11. Parks and BHF Elkhart will be responsible for posting promotional materials to the public.
- 12. General Liability insurance will be provided by Parks to BHF Elkhart in the amount of \$1 Million, and Parks will provide BHF with a Certificate of Liability, adding BHF Elkhart as an additional insured.
- 13. 
