#### **Optimize Operations**


- Update office space


#### **COVID19 Note:**







# **Amount of Education Programs**









### **Adult/Family Education: Programs and Events**

Though we had to cancel or alter many of our traditional programs/events, we were able to continue to host outdoor programs with additional safety measures and to provide some virtual programming, as well. **Climate Action Conversations:** This new program series is a part of our ongoing effort to create a Climate Action Plan for the City of Elkhart. These virtual sessions provide the public with updates about the Climate Action Planning process, information about environmental management practices included in the plan, as well as providing an avenue for public input and discussion. This series will continue into 2021 and possibly beyond as we move forward with the Climate Action Planning process.



# **Childhood Education**

While our childhood education programming was largely impacted by COVID19, we were still able to conduct some outside programs over the summer with safety precautions in place. However, due to City policy, we were unable to conduct any programs during the regular school year. Through our partnership with the Elkhart Education Foundation, we were able to conduct childhood education programs on the topics of:

# **Volunteer Program**

The Elkhart Environmental Center has long relied on the support of volunteers to staff our large events, lead programming, and to manage our site. Unfortunately, we missed seeing many of our regular volunteers due to COVID19 restrictions and the cancellation of many of our programs events. However, we are still so grateful for the support tat we received in helping to maintain and update our site! Major project accomplishments for our volunteer program this year include:

- Installation and maintenance of new Quilt Garden
- Replanting island rain garden
- Building benches on observation deck
- Installation of stone planter around entrance sign posts
- Maintenance of Learning Garden
- Trash removal from 2 Elkhart River Cleanups
- EEC office renovations





#### ACCOMPLISHMENTS



We were once again able to hire two interns, however this year both interns focused on site management due to our limited capacity for programs/events. With help from our interns and volunteers, we were able to:

- Add new gravel to our public boat launch, clear the area for better visibility, and add signage
- Stain, paint, and retouch the sign for our Learning Garden
- Repaint and restore our deck, stairs, and bridges
- Remove significant amounts of invasive honeysuckle and tree of heaven from our ecosystems
- Resume restoration efforts for our eastern prairie, including mowing and herbicide in preparation for replanting all-native prairie species
- Clean and organize the inside of our Visitor's Cabin
- Clean and organize volunteer tool shed
- Create an install new interpretive trail signs
- Invasive hemlock removal from western prairie

**Pavilion:** Thanks in large part to our group from the Greater Elkhart Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Academy, a new pavilion was constructed right next to the EEC's Visitor's Cabin. Our Leadership Academy team worked with the Rex and Alice A. Martin Foundation, TouchTronics, Inc., and MidStates Construction to fundraise for the construction. Their hard work and accomplishments were celebrated with a ribbon cutting ceremony. The pavilion was a timely addition: it enabled us to do more outdoor and social-distanced programming than before!

**Stone Planters:** Eagle Scout Jay Keen began work on this project in the summer. With help from Mark Walker and donations from Kuert Concrete, this project was completed in late fall. We are planning to have a ribbon cutting ceremony in spring 2021.
