
#### City of Elkhart Proclaims April 2024

#### Fair Housing Month

- WHEREAS, The Federal Fair Housing Act, enacted on April 11, 1968, enshrined into law the goal of eliminating racial segregation and ending housing discrimination in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, The Federal Fair Housing Act prohibits housing discrimination that is based on race, skin color, religion, gender, family status, national origin, and disability, and requires recipients of federal funding to affirmatively further fair housing in their communities; and
- WHEREAS, The City of Elkhart prohibits housing discrimination when renting or buying a housing, receiving a mortgage, seeking housing assistance, or engaging in other housing related activities;
- WHEREAS, Fair Housing is essential to the ethical commitment of the City of Elkhart and is crucial to serving our community. Our social fabric, economy, health, and environment are strengthened by diverse and inclusive communities; ongoing education, outreach and monitoring are key to raising awareness of fair housing principles, practices, rights and responsibilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that I, Rod Roberson, Mayor of Elkhart, Indiana, in support of our continued commitment to equal housing opportunities for all and keeping vibrancy in our town, do hereby declare the month of April, 2024 as FAIR HOUSING MONTH.

This month the Elkhart Human Relations Commission will be partnering with Heart City Health and Salvation Army to host a Fair Housing workshop for non-profits and service providers.


Our guest speaker will be attorney Erin Kemple of Kemple Fair Housing Consulting Services.

She is currently working with the National Fair Housing Alliance to establish a new fair housing council in Memphis, Tennessee.



# Fair Housing Issues



#### **Basic Needs**

Housing discrimination is denial of the most basic of needs for a human being. Where we live affects the type of education we receive, job opportunities, resources, healthcare, and even life expectancy.

Without safe, secure, equitable housing, everything else falls apart.



# Helping Landlords

We want to help landlords understand their rights and responsibilities under the fair housing law.

The Elkhart Human Relations Commission offers fair housing seminars throughout the year and is a resource, not only for tenants, but for landlords as well.



# Children

Under the Fair Housing Act, housing providers may not discriminate because a family has children.

Familial status covers:

- families with children under the age of 18,
- pregnant persons, and
- any person in the process of securing legal custody of a minor child (including adoptive or foster parents).
- persons with written permission of the parent or legal guardian



### Accessible Housing

The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in housing and housing-related transactions because of physical or mental disability.

# What Can I Do If I Experience Housing Discrimination?

If you or someone you know has experienced housing discrimination, please contact the Elkhart Human Relations Commission Staff by phone, email, or in person.

In the meanwhile, here are a few tenant tips:

- Keep a copy of your lease
- Keep copies of your receipts
- Keep copies of all correspondences
- Follow the rules of your lease including paying your rent
- Report any changes in your household or housing immediately

### Unsure what Unfair Housing looks like.....

Some examples:

- Refusing to rent to you due to your protected class
- Discrimination in housing rules for some and not others
- Advertising a rental in a way that excludes or shows a preference to a certain type of tenant
