(a) Claims with rigid payment deadlines. As provided for in the Elkhart Municipal Code §33.415, certain payments may be made prior to review and approval by the Board of Public Works. Typically such payments include utility bills, credit card bills, central services, association dues, employer-paid benefits, training, and employee reimbursements. Unusual items in excess of \$25,000 are noted in detail.

(b) Movement of monies between funds via check issuance and re-deposit. Done primarily for transfer of employer share of health insurance premiums and basic term life insurance premiums (100% employer paid) from various budgeted funds into the Group Insurance Fund (526) where it is combined with the employee share of health insurance premiums to be paid to the provider.

City Engineer Tory Irwin explained that after three years of negotiations with the IDEM, the EPA, and the DOJ, we are finally ready to amend the Wastewater Treatment Plant Consent Decree. Mike Machlan noticed in the memo they are not allowing us to save money (\$2-3 million) as we proposed by installing cloth media disk filters instead of increasing the secondary treatment capacity of the plant to 60 million gallons per day.

Change Order Request #3 & Final: Town Green project - Bid #20-04

Attached is change order request #3 & final for the Town Green project. This change order is for liquidated damages (LDs).

R. Yoder failed to meet the contractual deadline of February 5, 2021, which was already extended once by the Board of Works from an original date of November 20, 2020. The City attempted to work with R. Yoder in April and pause the time clock in an effort to wrap up the final items of work, however R. Yoder failed to even meet the deadlines they themselves established to wrap all items of work up. Having failed to meet the terms of our arrangement, LDs are requested through May 12, 2021 – the date all items were finally completed.

This change order request is for a decrease of (\$19,200.00) to the current contract price of \$401,403.00. Approval of change order #3 would decrease the final contract price to \$382,203.00 resulting in a 2.5% decrease from the original contract price of \$392,103.00.

It is requested the Board of Public Works:

Approve the release of all retainage and Change Order #3 & final for the Town Green project, Bid #20-04, for a decrease of \$19,200.00, bringing the final Contract price to \$382,203.00.

This agreement is between the City's Public Works and Utility and Elkhart Community Schools' Roosevelt STEAM Academy. The basis for this agreement is for the erection of a new double sided, LED illuminated sign. The sign will be located in the Roosevelt's parking lot adjacent to Benham Ave between Wolf Ave and Blaine Ave.

The City will contribute fifty percent (50%) of the costs to install the sign and manage the sign installation through the Benham Ave Streetscape project. For agreeing to this the City will share the use of the display area on the sign with Roosevelt. For every two hours School information is displayed, one hour of City information will be displayed. Roosevelt will have sole responsibility for the maintenance and operations of the sign.

It is requested the Board of Public Works accept and enter this inter-local agreement with Elkhart Community Schools.

# JOINT AGREEMENT FOR THE PAYMENT AND USE OF SIGNAGE

### THE PARTIES TO THIS AGREEMENT.

The parties to this agreement are the City of Elkhart by and through its Public Works and Utility Department (City) and Elkhart Community Schools (School), on behalf of Roosevelt STEAM Academy (Roosevelt).

### BASIS FOR THE AGREEMENT

Schools wishes to erect a new double sided, LED illuminated sign in the Roosevelt parking lot adjacent to Benham Avenue between W. Wolf Avenue and W. Blaine Avenue. (See Exhibit A). The School is seeking to offset some of the costs related to erecting the sign by offering an agreed amount of use of the sign to a third party. The City has expressed to the School that is interested in assisting with the cost of erecting the sign for a specific amount of use of the sign.

### **AGREEMENT**

THEREFORE, the City and the School agree as follows:

The City will assist with the erection of the sign by contributing fifty (50%) percent of the funds needed to erect the sign and remove the existing monument sign and by managing the installation through one of the City's construction projects. Erecting the new free standing sign has a quote of \$37,144.29 and removal of the existing monument sign has a quote of \$4,360.00. The sign is from North American Signs and will be managed through the City's Contractor Milestone LLC. The School shall submit fifty (50%) percent of the total amount to the City.

The City agrees to accept the amount paid to it by the School as the full and final amount owed for the erection of the new sign and removal. The school notes that the quote does not include a quote for the running and maintaining the sign and agree such cost is not part of this agreement. The School agrees that it has sole responsibility for the maintenance and utilities to operate the sign.

For agreeing to the participation from the City, the School agree to share use of the display area on the sign. The School, which is the party that will have control of the graphic posted in the display area, will display for every two hours it displays School information or other graphics, the School will use an hour of the display area to display City related information or other graphics. Should the School not display or over display City related information or other graphics, the School shall grant the City additional time for missed displays or Increase School displays on the next day following the over or under displaying of City information or other graphics. The City may voluntarily waive its allotted time to the School at any point.

The School is the sole party responsible for maintenance to the sign. The School agrees that the sign will be maintained in a condition that allow the sign to properly operate and in a condition that keep the sign not blighted and not in violation of any City code. The School is further responsible for making certain of the hours during which the sign may not be illuminated. Both the School and the City agree to not have the display area use any animated displays.

The City agrees that the freestanding ground sign is the sole property of the School. The School agrees that is shall insurer the sign for loses due to damage to the sign and damage to other parties. The School also agrees to indemnify, hold harmless and defend the City from any claim, including litigation, related to the sign.

This agreement shall be from May \_\_\_\_, 2021 until May \_\_\_\_\_, 2022. This agreement shall automatically renew for a one-year period on the stated termination date as long as the freestanding ground sign is existing and operational. The agreement may be cancelled by either party on for a material, incurable breach of this agreement. The material breach must be placed in writing to the other party. The material breach must also contain language whether the material breach can or cannot be cured.

The content for the display portion of the sign shall be exclusively controlled as to content by the party who message is being displayed on the sign. The party agree that the messages on the sign shall to be used in an unconstitutional manner, rude or uncivilized manner or an offensive manner. The sign shall not have any message or other content that is flashing or animated.



Mutual Confidentiality Agreement with American Electric Power

American Electric Power (AEP) crews have emptied stormwater out of their electric vaults and manholes for years. They usually discharge this into the nearest storm drain. This was brought to our attention and AEP was told to stop this activity until testing of the water is completed by them and the analysis is provided to Public Works for review and approval of such activity. This type of discharge, without approval, is actually an illicit discharge and is prohibited by our Illicit Discharge Ordinance (#5283).

If this agreement is approved and signed, AEP will give PWU location data in GIS format for all of their vaults and manholes in Elkhart city limits. With that information, we can then locate the nearest inflow points to our sanitary sewer for each structure for them to use to discharge this water as needed. Discharge will only be allowed if the water analysis shows no harmful substances and an acceptable sanitary discharge point can be located for each structure.

Legal staff has reviewed and approved this document.

Elkhart Environmental Processing (EEP), 1143 Oak St., Elkhart, IN. EEP is a waste treatment facility treating chemical toilet waste, septage, landfill leachate and grease trap waste.

EEP had a Fats, Oils and Grease effluent violation for a sample collected on April 27, 2021 by the POTW at the end of pipe. A follow-up sample was collected by the POTW; the table below summarizes the results showing that the facility returned to compliance.

The written response from EEP is attached; the Pretreatment group finds the explanation reasonable.

The Enforcement Response Plan, Section 9.1.1 (a) "Discharging wastewater containing metals in excess of established limits per parameter." Additionally, the Wastewater Utility Use Ordinance No. 5746, as amended states in Section 9.1 Effluent Limitation Penalties: Any User, who is found to have violated any Effluent Limitation set forth in this Ordinance, contained in the User's Industrial Wastewater Discharge Permit or found to have caused the POTW to violate any Effluent Limitation in the POTW's permit shall be fined no more than \$2,500.00 for each offense. This is a response to the violation for the exceedance for *Total Fats*, *Oils and Grease* reported on April 27, 2021.

Historically the operation of the Elkhart Environmental Processing Corp (EEPC) facility produces a level of FOG in the effluent well below the 200 mg/l daily maximum. During the time of the April 27 sampling event EEPC was performing some maintenance on the clarifier in service. It is believed that some agitation of the clarifier may have occurred that could have caused this exceedance. More care will be taken in the future to not allow this to happen, and our preference will be to take the clarifier out of service for any maintenance.

Clearly this exceedance is an outlier from the historical data and this should be confirmed at future sampling events. I would ask that Board to take notice that EEPC has not had a violation in over six years when determining an appropriate penalty.

Please contact me should you have any questions regarding this response as I will not be able to attend the July 6, 2021 Board of Public Works meeting.

B-D Industries, 800 Summa Drive, Elkhart, IN, B-D is an anodizing facility for the Aerospace Industry. They use an electrochemical process of changing aluminum to aluminum oxide. The Pretreatment Group is requesting a permit modification to include two non-destructive testing processes. These testing services are Magnetic Particle and Liquid Penetrant Inspections.

The first process (MPI) does not generate any wastewater, however, the second process (LPI) generates a small volume of wastewater due to the nature of the inspection. Liquid penetrant inspection is used to detect any surface-connected discontinuities such as cracks from fatigue, quenching, and grinding, as well as fractures, porosity, incomplete fusion, and flaws in joints. The process incorporates proprietary fluorescent dye that is drawn into discontinuities through capillary action. Once the fluorescent dye test is complete, the part(s) must be rinsed to continue the regular manufacturing processes.

Pretreatment recommends this permit modification approval.

#### MUTUAL CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT

This Mutual Confidentiality Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Indiana Michigan Power Company, an affiliate of the American Electric Power System, ("AEP") and the City of Elkhart, ("Elkhart").

#### Recitals:

- I. AEP and Elkhart desire to share shape files of AEP's Distribution Network facilities to enable both parties to review and illustrate AEP facility locations relative to the nearest Elkhart-owned storm water or sewer drains (the "Project") and may find it desirable or necessary to exchange certain confidential information during their discussions.
- II. The parties are willing to exchange confidential information pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

#### Section 1. Definitions.

- 1.1. "Confidential Information" means any information that is disclosed by the Disclosing Party to the Receiving Party or its Representatives in connection with the Project, whether before or after the date hereof and irrespective of the format in which the information is provided that is designed by the Disclosing Party as "Confidential Information." "Confidential Information" includes Critical Electric Infrastructure Information and any Evaluation Material prepared by the Receiving Party. "Confidential Information" does not include information which:
  - (a) is, or subsequent to disclosure becomes, part of the public domain through no fault of the Receiving Party;
  - (b) is lawfully disclosed to the Receiving Party by a third party which, to the knowledge of the Receiving Party, does not have a confidentiality obligation to the Disclosing Party;
  - (c) was lawfully in the possession of the Receiving Party prior to disclosure by the Disclosing Party; or
  - (d) is lawfully and independently developed by the Receiving Party without use of the Confidential Information disclosed by the Disclosing Party.
- 1.2. "Critical Electric Infrastructure Information" or "CEII" has the same meaning as provided in 18 C.F.R. 388.113(c)(1).
- 1.3. "Disclosing Party" means the party disclosing Confidential Information.

  AEP CONFIDENTIAL

- **1.4.** "Evaluation Material" means notes, reports or other documents which reflect, interpret, evaluate, include or are derived from the Confidential Information.
- 1.5. "Receiving Party" means the party receiving Confidential Information.
- 1.6. "Representatives" means a party's employees, officers, directors, attorneys, accountants and agents (including potential lenders, equity partners, underwriters, or other parties involved in the Project for the party), and the party's affiliates and the employees, officers, directors, attorneys, accountants and agents thereof.
- Section 2. Confidentiality. Except as provided in Section 5, the parties hereby agree that the Confidential Information will be kept confidential during the term of this Agreement. The parties also agree that without the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party, the Confidential Information will not be disclosed by the Receiving Party, in whole or in part, to any other person except as provided herein. Each party shall use the same care in protecting the other's Confidential Information as it uses to protect its own confidential information, provided that neither party shall use less than reasonable efforts to protect the other's Confidential Information. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Receiving Party may (a) disclose Confidential Information to its Representatives whose access is necessary to conduct the evaluations and negotiations in connection with the Project and who have been informed of the confidentiality restrictions contained in this Agreement and (b) make a limited number of copies of the Confidential Information in order for the Receiving Party to adequately use the Confidential Information subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement. Each party agrees to be responsible for any breach of the confidentiality obligations under this Agreement by its Representatives.
- Section 3. Ownership and Use of Confidential Information. All Confidential Information (except Evaluation Material) shall remain the property of the Disclosing Party. No license or other rights under any patents, trademarks, copyrights or other proprietary rights is granted or implied by the disclosure of the Confidential Information. Neither party shall use the Confidential Information for any purpose other than for evaluation of and negotiations relating to the Project.
- Section 4. Disposition of Confidential Information. The Receiving Party, upon written request from the Disclosing Party, shall promptly return or destroy all Confidential Information in its possession; provided, however, with respect to Evaluation Materials, the Receiving Party may at its discretion destroy such Evaluation Material. If requested by the Disclosing Party, the Receiving Party shall provide the Disclosing Party with a certification that all Confidential Information and Evaluation Material has either been returned or destroyed, as appropriate. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Receiving Party may retain one copy of the Confidential Information solely for archival purposes and for the purpose of demonstrating compliance with this Agreement. The return or destruction of the Confidential Information shall not extinguish any rights or obligations under this Agreement with respect to the Confidential Information.

Section 5. Legally Required Disclosures. If a party is legally compelled to disclose any of the Confidential Information, or if such disclosure is necessary in order to obtain or maintain regulatory or governmental approvals, applications or exemptions, the party making the disclosure shall promptly notify the other party of the disclosure. In such cases, the party making the disclosure shall reasonably cooperate with the other party to obtain a protective order or other reasonable assurance that the Confidential Information will be accorded confidential treatment. If the party making the disclosure is nonetheless legally required to disclose the Confidential Information, then such party may disclose the information without liability hereunder provided that the party may only furnish that portion of the Confidential Information which is legally required or necessary.

Section 6. Public Records Act. The parties understand that as a subdivision of the State of Indiana, Elkhart may be subject to the provisions of Ind. Code §5-14-3 related to the public's access to public records. In reliance on the representation of AEP, however, Elkhart will withhold from disclosure any Confidential Information provided to it by AEP, including information that AEP has designated as Critical Electric Infrastructure Information, or CEII, under the applicable provisions of Ind. Code § 5-14-3-4, including, without limitation, Ind. Code §5-14-3-4(b)(19)(J) and Ind. Code §5-14-3-4(a)(3).

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, Elkhart may release Confidential Information to a third party in response to a public records request submitted by such party only if ordered to do so by a court of competent jurisdiction or upon consent by AEP. Elkhart shall notify AEP as soon as reasonably practical, of any request to disclose Confidential Information, or that such a request has been made, so that AEP has an opportunity to take appropriate action to maintain the confidential handling of such information as provided under Indiana law.

**Section 7.** Term. The confidentiality obligations of this Agreement shall not expire.

**Section 8.** Remedies. The parties acknowledge that improper or unauthorized use or disclosure of Confidential Information could cause irreparable harm to the Disclosing Party and that monetary damages would not be an adequate remedy for a breach of this Agreement. In the event of any breach or threatened breach of this Agreement, the non-breaching party shall be entitled to pursue injunctive and other equitable relief, and the breaching party agrees to waive any requirement for the posting of a bond in connection with such remedy. Such injunctive and equitable relief shall not be deemed to be the exclusive remedy for a breach of this Agreement, but shall be in addition to all other available remedies. In no event shall either party be liable to the other for any incidental, indirect, special, punitive or consequential damages (including without limitation damages for lost profits).

Section 9. Relationship of Parties. Neither party shall have any obligation to commence or continue discussions or negotiations, to exchange any Confidential Information, to reach or execute any agreement with the other party, to refrain from engaging at any time in any business whatsoever, or to refrain from entering into or continuing any discussions, negotiations or agreements at any time with any third party, until each party executes a definitive agreement. Until such definitive agreement is executed, neither party shall have any liability to the other party with respect to the Project except AEP CONFIDENTIAL

as set forth in this Agreement. Neither party shall have any liability to the other party in the event that, for any reason whatsoever, no such definitive agreement is executed.

#### Section 10. General.

- 10.1. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana.
- 10.2. Entire Agreement. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties, supersedes any prior understandings or representations relating to the confidential treatment of the Confidential Information, and shall not be modified except by a written agreement signed by both parties.
- 10.3. Assignability. This Agreement may not be assigned by either party without the prior written consent of the other party; provided, however, that AEP may assign this Agreement to one or more of its affiliated companies.
- 10.4. Severability. All provisions of this Agreement are severable, and the unenforceability of any of the provisions of this Agreement shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement.
- 10.5. No Waiver. Failure of either party to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms and conditions shall not be deemed to be a waiver of those terms and conditions.
- 10.6. Counterparts and Faxed Signatures. This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, and in the absence of an original signature, faxed signatures will be considered the equivalent of an original signature.
- 10.7. Notices. Notices shall be in writing and shall be sent to the addresses listed below, by email, and either by personal delivery, by the U.S. Mail, overnight mail, fax or other similar means. All notices shall be effective upon receipt.
