

White Oak

Quercus alba



Flowers: Insignificant; yellow-green



Fruit: Acorn



Autumn Leaves: Dark red



Mature height	50—80 feet, can grow over 100 feet
Spread	50—80 feet wide
Growth rate	Moderate (13—24 inches per year)
Light	Full sun to partial shade
Soil	Neutral, deep, moist, well-drained
Hardiness Zone	3 to 9
Wildlife	Turkeys, wood ducks, pheasants, grackles, jays, nuthatches, thrushes, woodpeckers, rabbits, squirrels, and deer eat fruit and seeds
Fun Fact	Water- and rot-resistant; used to make wine and whiskey barrels, construction, and shipbuilding (the USS Constitution, the world's oldest commissioned naval vessel still afloat, is made of white oak)
